You are about to purchase a product that is not simple and may be difficult to understand.

What is this product?

Type	This product is a closed-ended investment scheme, trading on the Main Market of the London Stock Exchange (within the Premium segment).
Strategy	This product aims to provide its shareholders with regular, sustainable dividends and to generate capital appreciation through investment, directly or indirectly, in business-essential, revenue producing (or cost-saving) equipment and other physical assets.
Intended Investor	This product is designed for investors who are seeking exposure to asset finance investments and who are capable themselves of evaluating the merits and risks of the investment or other investors who have been professionally advised, and who have sufficient resources both to invest in potentially illiquid securities and be able to bear any losses (which may equal the whole amount invested) that may result from the investment.
Maturity	The C shares shall convert into new Ordinary Shares on the earlier of: i. close of business on such date as the Directors may determine; or ii. 28 June 2019.

What are the risks and what could I get in return?

Risk indicator

There is insufficient historical data available to carry out the risk and performance analysis for this share class, therefore the Ordinary Shares (ISIN: GG00BN56JF17) data has been used as a proxy.



The risk indicator assumes you keep the product for 5 years.

The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this fund compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because we are not able to pay you.

We have classified this product as 4 out of 7, which is a medium risk class. This rates the potential losses from future performance at a medium level, and poor market conditions could impact our capacity to pay you.

The following are some of the other risks materially relevant to the PRIIPs which are not taken into account in the summary risk indicator:

The fund is exposed to exchange rate volatility, as it holds assets denominated in multiple currencies. We endeavour to mitigate foreign exchange risk by conducting hedging operations. See prospectus for overall risk information.
